We are delighted to announce the launch of our “**ELS Recycling Project**”, running from **November 2nd to December 15th**. This initiative aims to inspire our students to care for their environment, develop responsibility, and use their creativity to turn recyclable materials into useful and beautiful products.

✦✦ **Project Highlights:**

- **Recycling Stations:** Picture OR Color-coded baskets for sorting materials, designed by our *Art* Department.
- **Awareness Campaign:** Posters, class presentations, and daily school radio messages by our *Library & ICT Departments*.
- **Creative Reuse:** In *Home Economics*, students will turn recyclable materials into useful and decorative items.
- **Active Leadership:** Our Student Council members with *German and French teachers* will guide and motivate each class as project leaders with the help of our **PE & Disciplinary Supervisors**.
- **Parent Engagement:** *Families* will be asked to send weekly recyclable items (plastic bottles, cardboard, fabric scraps, etc.) with their children — your encouragement will help make this project a success.

• **Competition & Prize:**

To keep students motivated, the project will also be a **friendly competition** between stages. The **winning team with the highest commitment and creativity and contributions** will be rewarded with a **special “PRIZE”** at the end of the project

• **Weekly Collection Plan (November 2nd – December 13th):**

- **Week 1 (2–5 Nov):** Registration in *ICT, Art, ICT, Home Economics, Library, 2nd language Helpers* OR *PE* with *disciplinary supervisors* and work with Art department in preparations
 - **Week 2 (9–12 Nov):** Plastic bottles & clean bottle caps
 - **Week 3 (16–19 Nov):** Cardboard boxes & cardboard tubes (tissue/kitchen rolls)
 - **Week 4 (23–26 Nov):** Fabric scraps, old T-shirts, or clean cloth pieces
 - **Week 5 (30 Nov–3 Dec):** Clean tin cans (without sharp edges)
 - **Week 6 (7 Dec–10 Dec):** Old newspapers, magazines, paper bags, envelopes, or unused notebooks (recyclable paper)
 - **Week 7 (14–17 Dec):** Plastic containers (yogurt cups, butter tubs, etc. – cleaned)
 - **Week 8 (21–24Dec):** Old CDs or small unused household items for crafts
 - **Week 9 (9–13 Dec):** Mixed recyclables (review of all categories above)
 - **Week 10 (16–19 Dec):** Final showcase – no collection, celebration of the winner groups.
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• **Why it Matters:**

This project is more than recycling — it's about **building awareness, teamwork, responsibility, collaboration and engagement in the school community**. By practicing these habits now, they prepare to become environmentally responsible leaders of the future.

We kindly ask for your **enthusiastic support** by talking with your children about the importance of recycling, helping them collect the weekly items at home, and motivating them to stay active in the project.
